Established in 1964, Job Corps is the nation's largest residential, educational and career technical training program for at-risk youth, ages 16 through 24. The 125 Job Corps centers nationwide provide an integrated, comprehensive array of services that include: academic, career technical and career success skills training; career planning and work-based learning; health care; and post-program placement and transition support.

On any given day, Job Corps graduates from "Smart Grid" advanced training programs can be found 100 feet up in the air, working as electrical linemen. During emergencies such as Hurricane Sandy, emergency line crews work around the clock to restore power. Job Corps has two such programs – at Oneonta Job Corps Center in New York State and Gary Job Corps Center in Texas – that train students in Overhead Line Technician and Underground Residential Distribution. In Program Year 2012, 100 students graduated from these programs with 96% placed in jobs at an average wage of \$12.00 per hour. Marathon efforts of long days during emergency conditions reward these workers with high wages and restore power to millions of households. While Job Corps only has two such programs in the country, they prepare students to work above or below ground – everywhere in the country.
